APPLICATION REQUESTING THE INSTALLATION AND USE OF A PEN REGISTER AND TRAP & TRACE DEVICE AND THE DISCLOSURE OF STORED ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND TRANSACTIONAL RECORDS PURSUANT TO FLORIDA STATUTES §934.32, §934.33, §934.23, AND §934.42 AND 18 U.S.C. §2703(d)

THIS (SUBPOENA, ORDER, WARRANT) IS ISSUED PURSUANT TO FLORIDA STATUTE S. 92.605. A RESPONSE IS DUE WITHIN 20 BUSINESS DAYS OF RECEIPT OF THIS (SUBPOENA, ORDER, WARRANT) UNLESS A LONGER TIME PERIOD IS STATED HERIN.

The State of Florida, by and through **Detective John Nguyen**, a duly sworn Deputy Sheriff of the **Orange**County Sheriff's Office, applies to the Court for an Order authorizing the installation and use of a pen register and trap and trace device, and the disclosure of stored electronic communications and transactional records for internet users accessing the social networking website **Instagram** account identified as

and hereafter referred to individually as the "TARGET INSTAGRAM ACCOUNT". The purpose of the proposed order is to gather the information from the foregoing **Instagram** Account (collectively, the "TARGET INSTAGRAM ACCOUNT") that will lead to evidence or assist in locating the victim. In support of this application, the government offers the following:

1. Applicant is an "agent for the government" and therefore may apply for an Order authorizing the installation and use of a pen register and/or trap and trace device for the aforementioned TARGET INSTAGRAM ACCOUNT.

^{1.} Pen repister means a device which records or decodes electronic or other impulses which identify numbers dialed or otherwise transmitted on the telephone line to which such device is anached, but the term does not include any device used by a provider or customer of a wire or electronic service for billing, or recording as an incident to billing, for communication services provided by the provider or any device used by a provider or customer of a wire communication service for cost accounting or other like purposes in the ordinary course of its business, nor shall the term include any device which allows the listening or recording of communications transmitted on the telephone line to which the device is attached

^{**}Trap and trace device* means a device which captures the incoming electronic or other impulses which identify the originating number of an instrument or device from which a wire or electronic communication was transmitted

- 2. Applicant certifies that the information likely to be obtained is relevant to an ongoing criminal investigation being conducted by the Orange County Sheriff's Office, in connection with a criminal investigation to locate evidence and/or who is a missing person/victim and endangered.
- 3. Applicant believes that the information gained from the proposed pen register and/or trap and trace device and disclosure of stored electronic communications and transactional records relating to the 'TARGET INSTAGRAM ACCOUNT' will substantially assist the Orange County Sheriff's Office in determining the exact whereabouts of the VICTIM.
- 4. Meta, Inc. is a provider of free electronic mail communications services. Instagram users access its services by means of the Internet's World Wide Web. Using a standard web browser program (such as Google Chrome or Internet Explorer) or mobile device (Cellular Phone), Instagram users may compose, send, and receive electronic mail through the computers or mobile devices in Instagram's network.
- 5. Whenever an Internet user visits Instagram's web site (or any other site on the Internet), that user's computer identifies itself to the web site by means of its Internet Protocol address. An Internet Protocol ("IP") address is a unique numeric identifier assigned to every computer connected to the Internet. An Internet Service Provider (ISP) normally controls a range of several hundred (or even thousands of) IP addresses, which it assigns to its customers for their use.
- 6. IP numbers for individual user accounts (such as are sold by ISPs to the general public) are usually assigned "dynamically": meaning each time the user dials into the ISP to connect to the Internet, the customer's machine is assigned one of the available IP addresses controlled by the ISP. The customer's computer retains that IP address for the duration of that session (i.e., until the user disconnects), and the IP address cannot be assigned to another user during that period. Once the user disconnects, however, that IP address becomes available to other customers who dial in thereafter. Thus, an individual customer's IP address normally differs each time he dials into the ISP. By contrast, an ISP's business customer will commonly have a permanent, 24-hour Internet connection to which a "static" (i.e., fixed) IP address is assigned.

- 7. These source IP addresses are, in the computer network context, conceptually identical to the origination phone numbers captured by traditional trap and trace devices installed on telephone lines. Just as traditional telephonic trap and trace devices may be used to determine the source of a telephone call (and thus the identity of the caller), it is feasible to use a combination of hardware and software to ascertain the source addresses of electronic connections to a World Wide Web computer, and thereby to identify and locate the originator of the connection.
- 8. That there is probable cause to believe that:
 - a. The suspect, Stephan Sterns, did knowingly commit Interfering with Child Custody, in violation of state law. It has also been revealed that the victim, has an active Instagram account with regular and continuous updates. has been reported missing since February 26, 2024.
 - b. Detective John Nguyen is a duly sworn Deputy Sheriff of the Orange County Sheriff's Office. Detective John Nguyen duties consist of assisting and conducting investigations related to the apprehension of wanted persons and fugitives.
 - c. During the course of this investigation, **Detective John Nguyen** has uncovered the 'TARGET INSTAGRAM ACCOUNT' as a means by which is posting updates and photographs to her "wall". The 'TARGET INSTAGRAM ACCOUNT' has been and continues to be active on a regular basis. A view of public Instagram "wall" indicates is logging on to the 'TARGET INSTAGRAM ACCOUNT' from various unknown locations.
 - d. By means of subpoenaed records only, apprehension efforts have been unsuccessful due to the time delay from which point the subpoena is served until which time the records are received making it impossible to determine the physical location of the **Instagram** access until weeks or months after the log-in has occurred. For this reason, I believe the pen register and/or trap and trace is the only method to determine real time locations of the internet access.
 - 9. Accordingly, for the above reasons, the applicant requests that the Court enter an order

authorizing the installation and use of a trap and trace device to identify the source telephone number and the IP address (along with the date and time) of all logins to the **Instagram** subscriber account

The applicant is not requesting, and does not seek to obtain, the contents of any communications.

IT IS THEREFORE REQUESTED, pursuant to FLORIDA STATUTES §934.32, §934.33, §934.23, AND §934.42 and 18 U.S.C. §2703(d) that the **Orange County Sheriff's Office** be authorized to install and monitor a pen register / trap and trace device to be used to determine the source telephone number and Internet Protocol address (along with date and time) of login connections directed to but not the contents of such communications and that the **Orange County Sheriff's Office** is authorized to provide technical assistance and upon request, install a pen register/trap and trace device.

IT IS FURTHER REQUESTED, that Facebook, Inc. shall not terminate the TARGET INSTAGRAM ACCOUNT during the course of the investigation unless otherwise authorized at the discretion and request of the investigating officer and agency. Until that time, Facebook, Inc. shall not make notice to the user and shall further allow the account to remain open without interruption as ordered by this court.

IT IS FURTHER REQUESTED, that pursuant to, FLORIDA STATUTES §934.32, §934.33, §934.23, AND §934.42 and 18 U.S.C. §2703(d) that this ORDER authorizing the installation and monitoring of the pen register and/or trap and trace device(s) and the furnishing of said "other records and/or information" shall become effective on the date of installation, but no later than ten (10) days from today's date and shall terminate sixty (60) days from the installation of the pen register and/or trap and trace device(s).

IT IS FURTHER REQUESTED, that pursuant to FLORIDA STATUTES §934.32, §934.33, §934.23, AND §934.42 and 18 U.S.C. §2703(d) and in accordance with the provisions of the aforementioned statutes, that Facebook, Inc., upon service of the order upon it, shall furnish information, facilities, and technical assistance necessary to accomplish the installation of the trap and trace device, including installation and operation of the device unobtrusively and with a minimum of disruption of normal service; and that the tracing operation shall encompass tracing the communications to their true source,

if possible, without geographic limit, and that the results of the pen register / trap and trace device shall be furnished to the **Orange County Sheriff's Office** regular intervals as directed by the **Orange County Sheriff's Office** for the duration of the Order.

IT IS FURTHER REQUESTED, that pursuant to FLORIDA STATUTES §934.32, §934.33, §934.23, AND §934.42 and 18 U.S.C. §2703(d) and that Meta, Inc. provide the Orange County Sheriff's Office with subscriber, credit and billing information along with an IP address history log which is a record of the IP address, date, time and duration for all logons to the Instagram subscriber account, and that pursuant to FLORIDA STATUTES §934.32, §934.33, §934.23, AND §934.42 and 18 U.S.C. §2703(d) that any/all Internet Service Provider(s) (ISP) that control the IP addresses revealed from the IP address history log and trap and trace provide the Orange County Sheriff's Office with complete subscriber information, physical location/address of the IP address, or cellular telephone number utilizing the identified IP addresses, credit and billing information for the account(s) assigned those IP addresses at those dates and times.

IT IS FURTHER REQUESTED, that pursuant to FLORIDA STATUTES §934.32, §934.33, §934.23, AND §934.42 and 18 U.S.C. §2703(d) that Facebook, Inc., will upon service of this Order provide an **Instagram** chat/messenger friend list to include time, date, and IP address login for chat and messenger within the prior 5-10 days; and

IT IS FURTHER REQUESTED, that pursuant to FLORIDA STATUTES §934.32, §934.33, §934.23, AND §934.42 and 18 U.S.C. §2703(d) that Facebook, Inc. and any other person or entity providing wire or electronic communication service in the United States whose assistance is used to facilitate the execution of this Order and their agents and employees shall not disclose to the listed subscriber, or any other person, the existence of this Order, the pen register / trap and trace device, or this investigation unless or until otherwise ordered by the court and further, that this application, sworn affidavit and Order be SEALED.

That this APPLICATION and ORDER is not requesting, and does not seek to obtain, the contents of any specific written communications or messages upon the aforementioned TARGET INSTAGRAM

ACCOUNT in any way.

IT IS FURTHER REQUESTED, that this APPLICATION and ORDER are to be sealed except for service upon members that have a need to know of the Orange County Sheriff's Office and the United States Marshals Service and the electronic communications service provider being requested to provide installation assistance and "records or other information" to avoid prejudice to the criminal investigation, and that the electronic service provider and its agents, employees, contractors, or subcontractors shall not disclose or cause to be disclosed the existence of this ORDER or the request for assistance or the existence of this investigation to any person other than those of its agents, employees, contractors, or subcontractors who require this information to accomplish the services, records, or information hereby ordered, unless and until otherwise ordered by this judicial official (this shall include but not be limited to the authorized user(s) of the account). In particular, no such disclosure may be made to a lessee, telephone subscriber, or any intercepted party or participant in the intercepted communications.





Discord was created for use by individuals playing video games to allow them to play and discuss games in private servers they have been invited into or create themselves. 



SCENE DESCRIPTION:

The scene was the above listed vehicle located at the OCSO Forensics Unit garage.

NARRATIVE:

On February 29th, 2024, I responded to location three to process the above listed vehicle. Corporal Alexander Richards served a search warrant to the vehicle. Evidence seals were present and intact on all four doors, the hood, and trunk of the vehicle.

A SunPass was on the interior front windshield. A red stain was on the front driver door jamb. A bowl of dog food, a bag with dog toys and treats, a pair of slip on shoes, a bag containing food and a water bottle, and a bag containing a prescription pill organizer and prescription bottles belonging to the suspect were on the front passenger floor. A Coca Cola can, hair clips, and a deflated balloon were in the front passenger door pockets. Nissan booklets, paperwork bearing the socket, and a charger plug were in the glove box. Hair, water bottles, and make up were under the front passenger seat.

A beach chair, a poncho, jumper cables, and a Target bag with automotive cleaning wipes were in the trunk. Stains were observed near the opening of the trunk. 




