I was administratively assigned this case through a standard case assignment protocol.

(1000)

I travelled to First Coast Child Protection Team (CPT) located at 4539 Beach Blvd. and met with Case Coordinator Moylan to view photographs of the victim and obtain a copy of the Preliminary Medical and Risk Assessment Report authored by Dr. Dully. CPT received this case after the Department of Children and Families (DCF) responded to an anonymous tip in reference to the neglect of the victim. Notable observations from this report are as follows:

Life Threatening and Life-Altering Medical Neglect, Nutritional Neglect, and General Neglect

The victim is listed as covered in feces with numerous severe skin ulcers from pressure. Lice was present in his hair and on his body. The victim is "locked into" a fetal position and has been, according to the suspect, for 6 months. Feeding of 8 oz of cow milk 5,6 times a day with "purees" was listed by the suspect as normal feeding which Dr. Dully states is insufficient in nutrients or calories. The victim was prescribed Pediasure. However, has not been receiving this, and has had no apparent medical care for years. The victim suffers from severe anemia and muscle wasting from malnutrition and nutrient deficiencies. The victim is in danger of severe illness or immediate death upon the onset of any infection. The victim is at risk of refeeding syndrome. Without any meaningful and enduring change in caregiving, the victim will likely die.

I observed pictures of the victim covered in feces, dried urine, and covered in large open sores on his back and pressure points. The victim's fingernails, teeth, and ear canals were all dirty, unbrushed, and unmanicured. His hair was matted and full of lice and debris.

General Neglect:

The victim was covered in dried feces and was infested with lice. The victim is both non-verbal and non-ambulatory. He can provide no self-care nor ask for help. He is unable to scratch any ltch he likely felt due to the lice. He has been in pain due to his limb contractions, skin ulcers, and expected bone pain from nutritional deficiency.

3/25/2025 (1000)

Det. Ruiz and I travelled to an analysis and met with the suspect who agreed to meet with me on 3/27/2025. During the visit, I observed the victim's room which had a large stain on the carpet. I inquired as to what the stain was and the suspect stated it was a urine stain from where the victim's bed was located.

3/26/2025 (1300)

I received the Medical Evaluation from First Coast Child Protection Team authored by Dr. Dully. Notable observations from this report are as follows:

Life-Threatening and Life-Altering Medical Neglect:

The victim has received no apparent orthopedic care for years. This lack of care permitted his contractures to progress to a point where he is not only immobilized, but his limbs cannot be moved. This resulted in ulceration at pressure points.

Severe Nutritional Neglect with Protein - Calorie Malnutrition. Severe Iron Deficiency with Anemia requiring blood transfusions: The victim's iron level was unmeasurably low. His calorie deficient diet was insufficient to allow for the healing of his skin ulcerations.

3/27/2025 (1130)

The suspect arrived at the Police Memorial Building located at 501 E Bay St. as agreed. Prior to this interview, the suspect was advised of her Constitutional Rights, which she acknowledged she understood, and was willing to participate in an interview without the presence of counsel. The following is a synopsis of the suspect's statement, as the entire interview was digitally recorded.

The suspect confirmed she assumed 24/7 primary caregiver status for the victim beginning in September, 2021. She did not obtain any legal guardianship paperwork and did not attempt to obtain those papers from the victim's parents. She was contacted by the victim's father and informed he would like her to adopt the victim. However, she did not agree to do this and did not at that time pursue power of attorney status over the victim. The suspect argued she bathed, fed, and treated the victim daily despite photographs documenting the victim's condition at presentation to the hospital showing the victim was covered in feces, urine, and lice. She stated the victim's limbs locked up approximately two months ago. The suspect

The victim was discovered by the Florida Department of Children and Families Child Protection Investigator in a state requiring emergency medical services, and was transported to Wolfson Children's Hospital located at 800 Prudential Dr. The professional medical opinion of First Coast Child Protection Team Dr. Dully is that he is the victim of life-threatening and life-altering medical neglect, severe nutritional neglect with protein - calorie malnutrition, and general neglect. The victim was covered in dried feces and was infested with lice. His limbs were locked into a fetal position with no ability to move or straighten them. The victim is both non-verbal and non-ambulatory. He can provide no self-care nor ask for help. Mary Bartholomew

A reasonable adult would find the victim's living state and conditions immediately alarming. Mary and Lamont Bartholomew's residence was clean, tidy, and well cared, evidence they are able to fulfill their personal needs for a clean and tidy living condition, yet the victim resided on a mattress soaked in urine and feces. Mary Bartholomew admitted to being the primary caregiver of the victim and was witnessed by Department of Children and Families (DCF) Child Protective Investigator (CPI) carrying the victim who only weighed approximate 30 pounds.

Ms. Bartholomew was interviewed

Mary Bartholomew willfully, or through culpable negligence failed or omitted to provide the victim with basic necessary care including food, medical treatment, and hygiene. In doing so, the victim was left with permanent, life altering, and immediately lifethreatening physical conditions. Ms. Bartholomew was the primary caregiver for the victim and the victim is a child who is 12years-old. The neglect was more than a lack of ordinary use of care for others as evidence by the victim's conditions.
